We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER) which provides key information on the 2019-20 educational progress for Baldwin Elementary School. The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains information about student assessment, accountability, and teacher quality. For the 2019-20 school year, schools were identified using new definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that has at least one underperforming student subgroup. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that has three or more underperforming student subgroups. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance is in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no label is given. Baldwin Elementary was not identified nor was it given a label.

Based on current data analysis from state assessments Baldwin faces challenges in the areas of reading and math, specifically with closing the achievement gap with subgroups like ELL learners. Staff at Baldwin will continue to develop analysis skills in order to be able to use data to plan for targeted instruction and a multi-tiered system of support. Ongoing professional learning supports our staff in implementing Teacher's College Units of Study in Reading and Writing K-5. We continually work to address student achievement in our school and have implemented the following interventions: Reading Recovery, LLI Leveled Literacy Intervention, iReady instructional modules in math, support through our ELL program, math support in LC class, and Special Education Language!, VMath to improve the achievement of all students in the school. The school improvement process (SIP) addresses these areas as well through initiatives such as Visible Thinking Routines, and Writing Across the Curriculum (CRAFT). Our building team and Positive Behavior Intervention Supports (PBIS) team also provide supports for students in the area of social-emotional development.

Process for Assigning Pupils to the School

Students continue to be assigned to schools by grade level according to the district attendance boundaries. Students residing in the district may request open enrollment in a school other than the one to which they are assigned during the Open Enrollment period. Open enrollment is approved on the basis of staffing and capacity in the building.

Struggling high school students are identified and assigned to the Alternative Center for Education (ACE) through the District's intervention model.

Status of School Improvement Plan

Baldwin Elementary is currently in our last year of our School Improvement Plan which will conclude in 2021. We continue to focus our efforts in the areas of reading, writing and math.

For the 2019-20 school year, Baldwin's goals continue to be:

Reading: All students will increase proficiency in reading as determined by district and/or state assessments.

Writing: All students will increase proficiency in writing as measured by district and/or state writing assessments.

Math: All students will be proficient in math as measured by district and / or state math assessments.

Core Curriculum

Rochester Community Schools continues to implement a comprehensive curriculum for all students. The curriculum is based on, and aligns with, the Michigan Department of Education's Michigan Curriculum Framework.

The curriculum department continues to focus on developing a Multi-Tiered System of Support to meet the needs of all students, providing alternative educational experiences for students and more flexible time for student learning beyond the traditional school day.

For those who were unable to meet in person, teachers contacted parents by phone.

- Baldwin continues to provide an English Language Learner center program. Non- English speaking students join us from Hugger, Brewster, Musson and North Hill.
